Report on Special Meeting Regarding Proposed Changes to Comprehensive Plan

Good news! The developer of Plan nomination 2RH withdrew their proposal on March 18, based on extensive objections raised by BBHCA residents and the Lee District Supervisor's office (also in response to BBHCA objections) and did not present at the March 18 meeting. This was a significant victory for BBHCA. However, residents strongly agreed that we need to learn a great deal more about the details of the current zoning on this property, and what the developer can and cannot do. A future BBHCA meeting will be scheduled with county staff to address this. It is likely that we will want to form a Task Force to pursue issues and options associated with this, and volunteers for that activity will be needed.

A representative for the developer of Plan nomination 1RH presented to more than 50 residents at the March 18 meeting. Following the presentation, Mr. Gill answered numerous detailed questions from BBHCA residents. Residents were generally satisfied with responses, however, most felt that they would not be affected by the development. Therefore it was agreed that BBHCA would defer to the position of the Gunnell Estates HOA (which is within the BBHCA boundaries) on this issue, as those residents will be directly affected by the development.

The area plan review by the Lee District Land Use Committee Task Force was postponed until 12 April.

Police Seek Witnesses to Road Rage Incident

A man was charged with malicious wounding after he allegedly cut another man with a knife during a roadside altercation on Tuesday, April 6. Around 4 p.m. that day, the two men were driving on South Van Dorn Street near Interstate 495. The victim was driving his gold Ford Expedition and came up behind a silver Cadillac CTS. The two drivers became involved in a traffic dispute after one driver perceived he was cut off by the other car. The two pulled to the side of the road on the I-495 ramp.

Both men, 54 years old, exited their vehicles and the driver of the Cadillac reportedly produced a knife and cut the victim twice on the arm. The victim fled the scene and drove himself to a nearby hospital. He was treated for non life-threatening injuries. The suspect, Keith Lewis, 54, of 180 South Van Dorn Street in Alexandria, stayed on scene until police arrived and arrested him. He was charged with malicious wounding and taken to jail.

A 21-year-old man was robbed inside his residence on Monday, March 29. Around 9:22 a.m., two men forced their way into a residence in the 7400 block of Pohick Road. Once inside, one of the suspects implied a weapon and held the victim. The other suspect took cash and property and both suspects fled the residence. The first suspect was described as black, in his 20s, and wearing an orange or red hoodie. The second suspect was described as wearing black gloves.

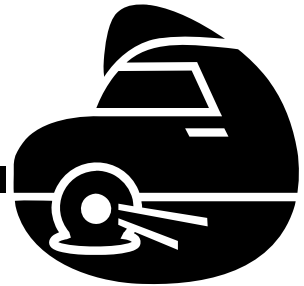

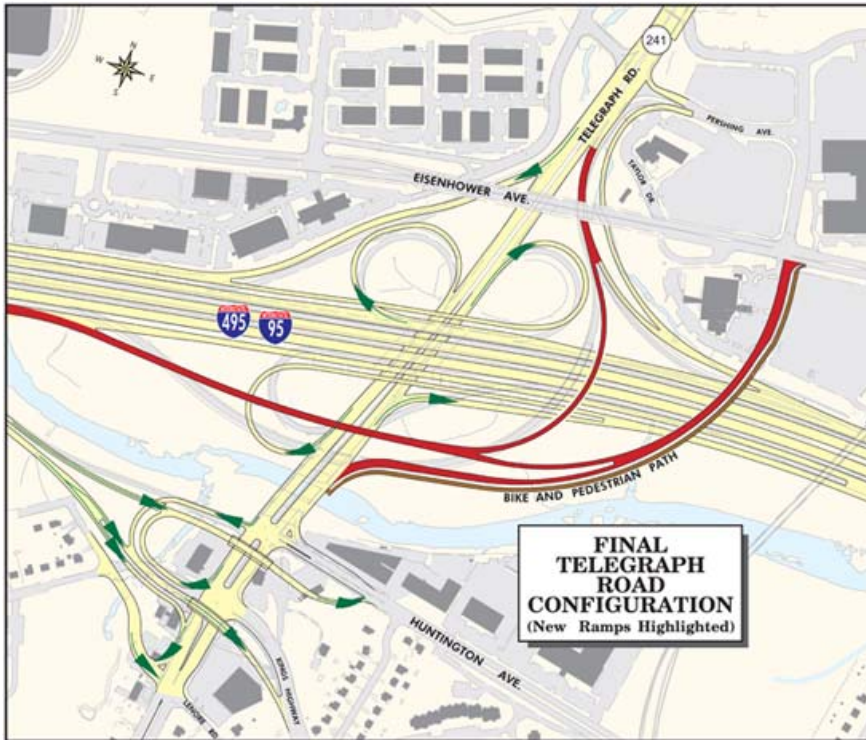
Telegraph Road | Eisenhower Avenue | 95/495

"When construction is complete in Fall 2010, three new ramps (red in the map) will significantly improve traffic flow from:

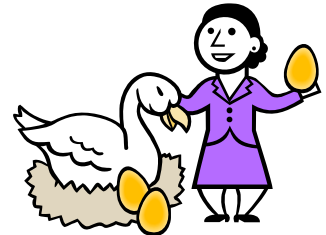
- Telegraph Road North directly to Eisenhower Avenue

Wildlife Volunteers Sought to Control Geese

The Fairfax County wildlife management program is seeking interested volunteers to join an effort to help control the growing population of Canada geese across the region. Volunteers will learn to use a safe and humane technique called “addling.” Addling is a simple process that was developed by the United States Humane Society that involves applying oil to goose eggs to prevent embryo development. Learn more about the ecology of geese and their behavior, how to locate and identify goose nesting areas and how to addle eggs.

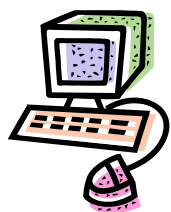

A report on my physician would cost \$12.95. My dentist's report was free, apparently due to a lack of data, and I was asked to complete a survey, which I did. For a local hospital I had to first select a condition, so I selected heart attack whereupon two hospitals were recommended along with an optional list of all other hospitals in the area. Information about the hospital was provided and reports were free for attending physicians in the full array of specialties. Furthermore, you can request an appointment online. HealthGrades also enables you to research and/or compare nursing homes. The report compares up to 10 facilities for \$19.95, and you can view a sample report. However, the "View Details" option does nothing more than list an address.
